## CADD Students Participate in Several Hands-On and Real-Life Experiences



CADD Engineering Technology students Alex Becker, Samantha Bishop, Raymond Douglas, Ben Hosler, Bobby Humanchuk, Lauren Kozich, Vince Nerone and Jaya Pickens participated in the 8th grade "Just Do It" assemblies at Mayfield, Memorial and West Geauga Middle Schools. Middle school students participated in hands-on projects illustrating engineering principles utilizing K'NEX at Mayfield and Memorial, and paper airplane engineering at West Geauga. Imagine building paper airplanes (and not getting in trouble for it) to study aerospace engineering!

In early 2013, we partnered with Bowden Manufacturing, of Willoughby, OH, to create a manufacturing internship program for CADD II students. This program gives CADD seniors an opportunity to work in a productive paid position, while gaining exposure to various aspects of engineering and manufacturing processes – an experience which would not be possible in a classroom setting alone. Eric Novick, CADD senior from Beachwood High School, is the first participant in this exciting program. We would like to thank Bowden Manufacturing for their interest in our program!

Lakeland Tech Prep invited the CADD I students to its annual Tech Prep Mock Interview day on May 22. Students experienced a valuable real-life experience, participating in mock interviews with area business professionals. The interviewers gave students written feedback on various aspects of their interview session. In preparation for the event, CADD I students created resumes and reference sheets, as well as practiced interviewing techniques.

CADD II student Michael Mehling partnered with the Excel TECC Business Academy Entrepreneurship Team to create drawings of their ZOOMZ Racing and Entertainment Center for use in the team's presentation at the Skills USA Championship in Columbus. This project utilized the former Catalano's space in Highland Heights. The team earned a gold medal for their project!



"Engineering Paper Airplanes" drawing and images, part of the "Just Do It" assembly at West Geauga Middle School


