### **Medical Technologies**

The end of another school year is always cause for reflection. For the Medical Technologies program it has proven to be an exciting, challenging, investigative time. Congratulations are extended to our 38 graduating seniors who will be attending the following colleges and universities - The University of Akron, Kent State University, John Carroll University, The Ohio State University, Bowling Green State University, University of Toledo, Ursuline College, Miami University, Ohio University, Atlanta Clark University, Cleveland State University, Westminster University, Slippery Rock University, , and The University of Tampa. Major areas of study for Medical Technologies students range from Nursing, Physical Therapy, Radiology, Forensic Medicine, Pharmacy, to Medicine.

Seniors completed their Medical Internships throughout the year at University Hospitals, Cleveland Clinic Health Systems, University Hospitals Clinics, Mayfield Village and Mayfield Heights Fire Departments as well as local Physician, Dental and Oral Surgery Centers. Students worked in NICU, CICU, MICU, Cardiac Cath. Laboratory, Pediatrics, Maternity and Family Services, Emergency Room, Oncology, Orthopedics, Pharmacy, and Medical/Surgical Departments.

This spring, Junior students participated in the Mayfield School District Kindergarten Screening in March. In April and May the juniors were busy with "8th Grade Career Day" presentations at West Geauga, Brush, and Mayfield, including "hands-on" activities involving medical skills and procedures.

Medical Technologies Seniors were invited to tour the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's office. Students got the opportunity to meet Dr. Thomas P. Gilson MD, the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner.

May 10th saw the inception of the first community "Smile Mission." The old Regional Mayfield Library was transformed into a free dental clinic for our community. In partnership with Dr. Joseph Krajekian DMD MD, Case Western Reserve Dental School and Excel TECC, Medical Technologies students assisted professional dentists, hygienists,' and dental assistants with preventative dental services, restorative dentistry, surgical services and medical screening for the communities of the Mayfield School District. Professionals saw over 115 patients. Student participation in the "Smile Mission" was managed by Medical Technologies Senior Mynor Mendez.

Representing Excel TECC in the Ohio State SkillsUSA competition in Columbus this April were Morgan Widina in Medical Terminology and Oroshay Kaiwan in Medical Mathematics. Both were medal recipients' at the Regional level, winning medals to qualify them for state competition.

Senior Medical Technologies student Oroshay Kaiwan's published research project "*The Effect of Hyperglycemia on the Incidence of Retinopathy of Prematurity*," demonstrated that advanced ROP (Retinopathy of Prematurity) infants have a higher glucose intolerance and tend to be more premature to gestation and weight than prematurity due to other causes. This past fall, her research was recognized by the Sigma X; Student Research Association. Oroshay was honored at the association's National Conference in North Carolina. She was also invited to present her research at the BEST Competition at the University of Akron where she was awarded a scholarship.

Joseph Roznik, a junior in Medical Technologies was selected to participate this summer in the National Youth
