During Governor DeWine's update this afternoon, the governor announced that in response to the increase in coronoavirus cases coupled with the imminent need to slow the spread of the virus, all Ohio schools, facilities and public school events will remain closed through Friday, May 1, 2020 and online, remote learning will continue as directed.

Gov. DeWine stated the date to return to the classroom will be closely monitored and reevaluated by state and health department leaders in conjunction with the Centers for Disease Control.

As you know, today marks the first day of online, remote learning for our students which our teachers and tech staff have been tirelessly preparing for over the last several weeks. While our facilities remain closed until May 1st, our goal remains the same – we will continue to instruct our students.
