1874	Women's Christian Temperance Union (WTCU)	united women in fight against alcohol abuse • Frances Willard
1890	National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA) founded	 Elizabeth Cady Stanton Susan B. Anthony goal of organization - get the vote for women
1910	membership in women's clubs increases General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC)	 almost 1 million members helped with community improvements and projects 40 percent of college students were women
1913	National Woman's Party (NWP) founded	 Alice Paul used parades and public demonstrations to draw attention to its cause also used civil disobedience, hunger strikes, and pickets - controversial NWP leaders jailed for actions
1916	national support for women to vote	Democratic and Republican Parties support giving women the right to vote
1919	18th Amendment	banned manufacture, sale, or distribution of alcohol in the United States - PROHIBITION
1920	19th Amendment	gave women the right to vote in the US
