Some of your students are creating entries for academic contests, such as the National History Day contest, the 3M Young Scientist's Challenge, or C-Span Student Cam. They will be working on these items during their Genius Hour time.

This week in LA, seventh graders shared their creations based on their books and understanding of conflict. We had some very creative works! Matthew K.'s poem spinning the classic Lord of the Flies in the style of Dr. Seuss and Kennedy H.'s poem for two voices inspired by Legend really stood out, as did Grace F.'s comic with its multifaceted artistic approaches. All of the students worked very hard and shared some deep thinking!

We also introduced Genius Hour to 6th and 8th grade (it is coming next week for 7th grade!). Genius Hour is based on a Google business practice, where employees are allowed to spend 20% of their time on a project of interest, provided that it can advance the company in some way. Likewise, we are beginning "Passion Projects" of our own to work on during Genius Hour. Proposals are due next week for grades 6 and 8. Talk to your student about their interests. Their passion project should be guided by a true desire to master something—and it can be anything at all—and should begin with an essential question.

An essential question cannot be answered with a simple yes or no, it must be researched, tested, composed; it guides deeper thinking, creativity, and analysis. For example, "What does it take to get a novel ready for publication?" or "How can robotics help patients with Parkinson's disease?" or even "How can I design and sew my own fashions?"

By allowing students the freedom to compose and pursue the answers to their essential questions, and then share their products globally, we can not only train them to be organized, to manage a timeline, and to research, but we also allow them to be true agents of change whose ideas can inspire others to greater heights. After all, if Shakespeare kept all of his writing in a drawer, we would never have the multitude of works based on his genius.

Genius Hour work will happen both in and out of the Gifted Resource Room. More info will come as we get further into the process.


