This is an unprecedented time for our Mayfield City Schools, as a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and the global, national, state and local efforts to slow the spread of the virus.

PLEASE take the time to read this critical communication in its entirety.

As a result of today's declaration from Ohio Governor Mike DeWine, Mayfield City Schools is closing all school facilities to students, the public and public events at the end of school day Monday, March 16 which is a scheduled Teacher Work Day. We will continue instruction online and remotely. Our facilities will be staffed accordingly.

It is imperative to take note: Student instruction WILL continue online and remotely. **We are closing our facilities. We are not stopping instruction.**

Between now and early next week, teachers and principals will be in contact with students and families to address remote, online learning.

Monday, March 16

Teacher Work Day – No Students.

Our teachers will update their records and prepare for the extended school closing. Our custodial team will continue to aggressively deep clean our schools, classrooms, bathrooms, buses, cafeterias, etc.

Tuesday, March 17- Friday, March 20

Teachers/principals will continue to communicate with students/families, regarding online, remote learning by grade level. During this time, the technology and remote system for instruction will be tested.

At this time, all Mayfield City Schools activities, events, athletics, clubs, field trips and Wildcat Sport & Fitness operations are cancelled, until further notice.

SPRING BREAK TRAVEL

The Centers for Disease Control and the U.S. Department of State continue to update their travel advisories in response to the global coronavirus.

If you have plans over spring break to travel/cruise to any region that is assigned a travel risk advisory, we ask that you notify your school building office in advance of your travel. Upon the recommendation of the CDC and U.S. State Department, students/staff will be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days.

These precautions are being implemented to protect the health and safety of our students, staff and community.

We will continue to update you as new information arises.
