During Governor DeWine's update this afternoon, **the governor extended the Stay At Home order through May 1, 2020** as a means to slow the spread and number of coronavirus cases in Ohio. [According to the State coronavirus website, "This order prohibits holding gatherings of any size and closes all nonessential businesses. It does NOT prohibit essential activities like going to the grocery store, receiving medical care, or taking your pet for a walk."](#)

The Stay At Home order reinforces Gov. DeWine's directive on March 30<sup>th</sup> which closes all Ohio schools, facilities and public school events through Friday May 1, 2020. All students and teachers will continue online, remote learning at home. While our facilities remain closed through May 1st, our goal remains the same – we will continue to instruct our students.
