SIX DEGREES OF COLLEGE PLANNING - STEP 1

- 1. WHY do you want to go? Really?
- 2. What are your strengths? Weaknesses?
- 3. Assess your personal goals in life
- 4. Is college just "the plan" or have you thought of other options?
- 5. Have you explored careers at all?
 - a. Career Shadow Days NOW available (excused absence)

STEP 2 - ASK YOURSELF, WHAT CAN A COLLEGE DO FOR YOU

- 1. What majors or educational programs do they offer? Are they accredited?
- 2. What levels of degrees do they offer? Accelerated tracks? 4 + 1 programs?
- 3. What are their college & program admissions requirements & policies?
- 4. What about the location and size? History & culture?
- 5. How much will it cost you? Scholarships? Net Price Calculators.
- 6. What campus activities can you get involved in?
- 7. Internship opportunities and co-ops?
- 8. Do they have support services (especially if you have an IEP or 504)?

PLAN TO PLAY SPORTS IN COLLEGE

- 2. End of senior year, transcripts uploaded to NCAA Website
- 3. Students monitor NCAA Core Graduation Requirements (watch Financial Algebra)
- 4. Register online and create an account THIS YEAR!
 - a. <u>Register for NCAA Eligibility Center</u>

FROM THIS POINT... during junior year

- 1. Student/Parent Login to Naviance
 - a. Email was sent freshmen year with registration codes for parents
 - b. Select & FAVORITE 💙 three five colleges of interest on your list
 - c. Update resume and start asking for letters of recommendation (due October 1)
 - d. Begin Common App JUNIOR profile NOW
- 2. Register for ACT/SAT prepare for the FREE school day SAT (April 2021)
- 3. Plan College Visits (schedules on colleges' websites or virtual)
- 4. Schedule career & college planning individual & family sessions with us!
- 5. <u>ESL/International Students</u> FREE International Student Support services
- 6. Connect with military reps
- 7. Look for internship or capstone opportunities

How do I find people to shadow? Share your interest and call in the community. Work with your counselor, teachers, family & friends! Yes, we can find virtual connections too!

What are the letters of recommendation for? Are they supposed to be for a specific school? If not, how would we ask for letters of recommendation from teachers if we don't know yet what we will need them for? Some colleges or scholarships require LOR while others are optional, have one ready either way! They could be specific or general - you decide what you need and communicate with the person writing it. Also, search this information on the college admissions' websites to find what you need prior to asking teachers. Just don't find out too late and ask last minutel

When do I start applying for scholarships? ANYTIME NOW until you graduate from college!
