- <u>Sewer Assistance</u>: The Crisis Assistance Program offers financial assistance in the amount of 50% of your sewer balance up to \$300 toward your account. This assistance is available to persons who can provide documentation demonstrating financial hardship brought on by loss of job or other unanticipated event that occurred within the past six (6) months.
 - Walk-in Appointments will be accepted from 8:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.
 Monday Friday. Scheduled appointments begin at 1:30 p.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. Monday -Thursday. To schedule an appointment, please call 1-888-901-1222.
 - Please bring with you a photo I.D., social security card, proof of all household income for the last 90 days, copies of your most recent gas, electric, water and sewer bills, proof of home ownership, and documentation of hardship/crisis.
