WHAT IS COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS?

College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual credit

program.

- Students earn high school **AND** college credit at the same time.

- Students enroll in college courses and adhere to the requirements of the college.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Students in grades 7 through 12 are able to **apply** to any CCP program.

May apply to any public or private **participating** college.

- May apply to multiple institutions.

THINGS TO KNOW

- May choose from a variety of college level courses
 - May be determined by placement testing
- Students can earn credit to satisfy both high school and college requirements.
 3 Credit Hours = 1 High School Credit

• Must successfully complete the course in order to earn the credit.

THINGS TO KNOW

May take classes in the summer, fall, and spring semesters. **30 credit hours per school year**

• May take courses at the high school, college campus, or online.

• Transportation is NOT provided for courses offered on the college campus.

HOW CAN STUDENTS PARTICIPATE?

- Step 2: Apply for admission
- Step 3: College entrance exam/GPA
- Step 4: Meet with college advisor &

high school counselor

• Step 5: CCP Authorization form signed

STEP 1: INTENT TO PARTICIPATE

Please complete this checklist. You must provide documentation to demonstrate completion. Before April 1st, meet with your counselor to confirm your plan for CCP Enrollment. Failure to do so may result in ineligibility for CCP.

- Attend or View The Mayfield CCP Informational Session
- Talk with your school counselor. Discuss your interest in taking college courses and how it fits in with your overall academic plan and career goals.
- Complete the Intent to Participate Form and submit to your school counselor. This prompts your counselor to submit your transcript to the CCP program of choice.
- Apply to the college. Students are responsible for meeting deadlines, submitting application forms, and meeting criteria for acceptance into College Credit Plus
- Complete an assessment exam' to determine eligibility for participation (requirements may vary by college). Please note: Assessment exam may not be required if the student has a minimum GPA. See your counselor for details.

Circle one: SAT ACT Accuplacer

- Acceptance into CCP Program. The college or university has notified you of acceptance.
- Notification of Acceptance. Communicate to your school counselor confirmation of acceptance into the program and discuss CCP course registration.
- I understand that if the above items are not completed by <u>April 1st. 2023</u>, I cannot be guaranteed a seat in a <u>Mayfield CCP Course</u>.
- I understand that if the above items are not completed by <u>May 1st, 2023</u>, I cannot be guaranteed MHS approval to register for a non- Mayfield CCP course in Summer '23 or Fall '23.

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STEP 2: APPLY FOR ADMISSION

- Students must apply for CCP admission on the college website
- Contact the college directly to learn about their processes, policies, procedures, paperwork, and deadlines.
- <u>Colleges make the final decision</u> on student's admission.

STEP 3: CRITERIA FOR STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

A student is eligible for the "College Credit Plus" program if the student meets one of the following criteria:

- Obtains a remediation-free score on one of the standard assessment exams, such as
 - ACT
 - SAT
 - Accuplacer

(Each college has different exam requirements per assessment)

- Has a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average of at least 3.00
- Has a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average of at least 2.75 but less than 3.00 and received an "A" or "B" grade in a relevant high school course.
 - Final eligibility is determined by the college/university

STEP 4: MEET WITH COLLEGE ADVISOR

Once the student is determined eligible to participate, they will:

- Submit a CCP permission form from the college/university
- Attend a New Student Orientation
- Discuss course options with the college advisor directly.
- Confirm with Mayfield school counselor any intentions on meeting specific high school graduation credits

STEP 5: REGISTRATION

Meet with MHS counselor to:Discuss registered CCP courses

- Confirm CCP courses will satisfy high school graduation requirements.
- Scheduling conflicts and questions
- Sign off on CCP course registration form (if applicable)

ANY RESTRICTIONS?

- Courses must be college-level or non-remedial
- Courses must be nonreligious
- Private applied courses with one-on-one instruction (such as performing art/musical lessons)
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- Pass/Fail graded courses

WHAT ABOUT THE GRADES?

- CCP grade earned is the same grade that will be on the high school transcript.
- Grades will be factored into high school <u>and</u> college GPA.

• Courses are weighted the same as Advanced Placement courses depending on the subject area. Weight will vary.

HOW MANY CLASSES CAN A STUDENT TAKE?

- 30 credit hours **including** high school courses.
- Maximum credits allowed during the life of your student's program is 120
- If student enrolls in more than 30 credits:
 - Have to drop the course.
 - Responsible for paying for the course and books.

HIGH SCHOOL VS. COLLEGE: EXAMS

High school: Exams are given more frequently

College: Fewer exams that cover more material

HIGH SCHOOL VS. COLLEGE: STUDY TIME

• High School: 1 to 3 hours of homework per day

• College: 2 to 3 hours of homework for every hour spent in class

HIGH SCHOOL VS. COLLEGE: PARENT ROLE

- **High School:** Parents are strong advocates working closely with teachers and counselors
- College: Parents serves as a mentor and support for the student; the college views the student as independent decision maker.
 - FERPA (Family Education Rights and Privacy Act) protects student education records.

BENEFITS OF CCP

- Earn high school and college credits at the same time
- Courses not offered/available at MHS
- Students can get a head start on college degrees and certificate programs
- Experience college early
- Save on tuition and textbook cost

UNDERPERFORMING

- Fail or withdraw too late = parent(s)/guardians and student responsible for paying the tuition costs.
 Failed grades will appear on both high school and college transcripts.
- Academic probation
- Financial aid may be negatively impacted if student withdraws too late or fails.

EXPENSES FOR COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

• No cost if attending a public college or university.

• A small cost per credit hour may be charged for private colleges.

STUDENT SUPPORT

- School counselors available to assistCollege advisors provide guidance
- Colleges provide the same supports to CCP students as they do for other college students
- IEP or 504 accommodations as determined by college

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

Know and understand the OHSAA requirements

 Summer term CCP courses may not be used to bring a student into compliance with the OHSAA requirements for interscholastic athletic participation

TRANSFERRING COURSE CREDITS

• Students must check with receiving colleges to confirm transferability

 Students should check <u>https://transfercredit.ohio.gov/</u> for transfer info

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE COLLEGE READY?

Being more than academically ready:

- Consider emotional and social transition and college expectations
- Time management and organizational skills
- CCP credits will be utilized in the calculations of financial aid for post-high school

MATURE CONTENT PERMISSION

Ohio requires new CCP students and parents to complete a Mature Content Permission Slip

The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs.

WHAT ARE THE DEADLINES?

APRIL 1st

- Students must complete and submit the
 Intent to Participate form
- Check ACT and SAT dates, if needed

• Check each college/university for their admission deadline

MHS CPP COURSES

Lakeland Community College courses offered at MHS:

ENGL 1110 English Composition I
ENGL 1120 English Composition II

Courses taught by Mayfield staff on Mayfield's campus during regularly scheduled periods.

CCP ENGL 1110 English Composition

Grades 10-12

Semester Course – 3 college credits 1 high school credit

This course focuses on the writing process and on the composition of expository writing assignments, including personal, informational, and critical essays. Students will read and analyze expository and imaginative texts (fiction, nonfiction, poetry, or drama). Because of duplication in course content, students who have taken ENGL 1110 English Composition I (B) should not take this course. (3 contact hours)

CCP ENGL 1120 English Composition

Grades 10-12

Semester Course – 3 college credits 1 high school credit

Prerequisite: ENGL 1110 or ENGL 1111

This college course analyzes argumentative strategies, models, and texts. Students will focus on the research process: identifying sources through electronic and print-based research strategies, evaluating research materials, and integrating and synthesizing research material. The course culminates in the production of multiple argumentative compositions. (3 contact hours)

MHS CCP COURSES

Steps to participate in CCP courses at MHS:

- Schedule in IC Academic Planner
- Submit Intent to Participate Form
- Be eligible for CCP based on
 - GPA/assessment exam scores
- Apply to Lakeland & send transcript
 - Attend Lakeland's Orientation
 - Submit Mature Content Permission slip

to LCC

*Everything completed by April 1st

ADVANCED PLACEMENT VS. CCP

AP

- College credit earned when student scores a level 3 or higher on AP exam.
- AP credit earned is on high school transcript only.
- Can take as many AP courses as the student's schedule allows.
- Credit may be transferred to any Ohio public institution of higher education.
- Cost to take AP exam.

College credit earned by passing course.

CCP

- Courses are reported on both college and high school transcript.
- Limited to 30 credits hours per school year.
- Many entry level courses are transferable to any Ohio public institution of higher education.
- Tuition free UNLESS student fails a course.
