ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

COST:

- a. Doors will open at 6:00 p.m. **no earlier**.
- b. Crowning of the prom queen and king will follow dinner at 7:20 p.m.
- c. If you are taking a date from another school, please refer to the digital form on the HomeTown Ticketing site, this must be completed. Guests must follow all Mayfield rules, regardless of their ages. Students entering the prom will have their names checked for accountability purposes and will not be permitted to leave and return. Once the student leaves the prom, it is assumed that a parent will know of his or her child's whereabouts. The school chaperones cannot be responsible for students after they leave the prom.
- d. Parents are encouraged to discuss safety and proper behavior for this occasion with their son or daughter.
- e. Students under the influence of alcohol or any other chemical substance will not be permitted to enter the prom and will be suspended from school and may forfeit the privilege of attending commencement exercise.
- f. Parents are expected to <u>not serve alcoholic beverages</u> of any kind prior to or after the prom. Student safety while driving is of the utmost importance. Remember, the <u>legal drinking age in Ohio is 21 for any alcoholic beverages</u>, and the state law specifies that any driver under 21 years of age <u>who tests as low as .01</u> on a breathalyzer will be charged with a DUI.
- g. Students are expected to dress in proper attire throughout the entire prom. Good taste is the order of the evening.
