Dear Mayfield Parents, Staff, Community and Students,

Important information affecting Mayfield High School families, students and staff.

Mayfield High School has been on a full remote learning plan since November 10th. It has been my hope that MHS families, students and staff would once again be able to choose an in-person learning option as of November 30. Unfortunately, this will not be possible due to the increasing trends of positive COVID-19 cases and quarantines among staff and students.

Therefore, I am extending the full remote learning plan until at least December 7th.

Between now and December 7th, we will continue to analyze the trends and track the cases. If the trends continue to negatively impact our staffing then I will recommend to the Board of Education that Mayfield High School remain on a full remote learning plan until at least the beginning of the second semester on January 4th. I will make this decision by Friday, December 4th.

Every day, we analyze the COVID-19 related staffing data and assess the feasibility of maintaining in-person learning. We examine the data by grade level, team, program and building - then make decisions accordingly. The best way I can say it is this: If we can't staff it. We can't have it. This includes sports and activities.

Our actions over the coming days and weeks can either have a profound positive impact or a devastating effect. Please commit to doing everything possible to prevent further community spread and further closures to our in-person learning option.
